






Cue Card

CueCard is a simple and intuitive flash card program. Just make up cards for what you want to memorize, and CueCard will quiz you on them. CueCard automatically focuses on the cards you are having trouble with. For each topic, write up one set of index cards with the word on the front, and the definition on the back. Shuffle them and drill yourself.

Each make a set and swap with friend/LSA.
